

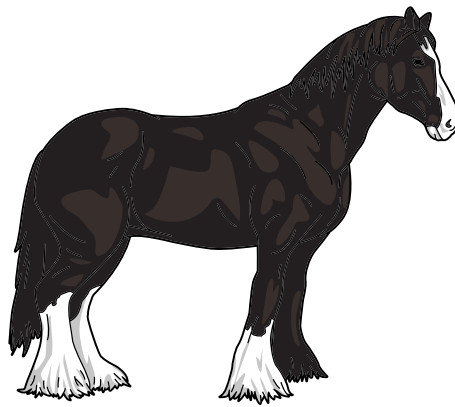
ANIMAL FACT MATCHING/MEMORY GAME

DIRECTIONS:

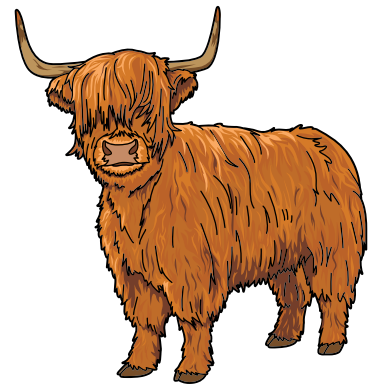
1. Print out the card sheet (use cardstock for studier cards!).

4. For a more challenging game, place the cards face down and play memory by taking turns finding the animal image and its corresponding card.



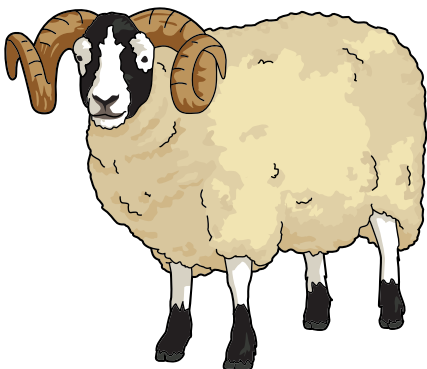

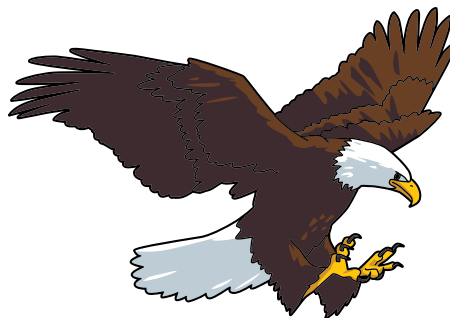
Clydesdale

I am highly trainable and intelligent. I excel in various sports, including obedience, flyball, agility, tracking, and flying disc competitions.

I am one of the largest species of my kind in the world with a wingspan over six feet. I am a highly sedentary animal and usually maintain a single territory throughout my adult lives.

I consume as much as 150 lbs. of grass and graze about eight hours each day. I am famous for my long-haired coat. It is perfect for coping with the harsh weather conditions of the Scottish Highlands.

Approximately 70% of my day is spent feeding. I can feed on as many as 650 flowers each day. I have very specialized tongues for feeding on nectar. Tiny hair-like structures called 'papillae' line the end of my tongue in the shape of a "U".

I originated from the mountains of Scotland, and I live on average 10 to 12 years. Females of my kind are known as ewes and males are known as rams.

I communicate using vocalizations, scent marking, and body language. Howling is used to communicate territorial cues over long distances and helps to bring the pack back together when they are dispersed. Everyone in my pack has a distinct howl.

I get my name from white feathers on my head, neck, and tail. My name comes from an Old English word meaning white. I was named for my white feathers instead of a lack of feathers.

You can tell when I am dreaming because I will move my legs in my sleep. I normally sleep 16 hours a day. I am one of the largest breeds of my kind. I can stand 17 to 18 hands high (a hand is four inches) I typically weigh between 1,800 and 2,000 lbs.
